State of Ohio, Clinton County, ss:- In pursuance of an act of the legislature of Ohio entitled an act to enable the holders of land within this state to perpetuate testimony relative to their lands passed January the 2<sup>nd</sup> 1824. I hereby certify that by request of William Sharp sen. I have surveyed his land for the purpose of establishing the corners of the same as follows:

Said land is part of two original surveys No 5355 & No 6298. Beginning at a stone (marked A on the plat) where a burr oak 15 inches in diameter bears N. 51° E 15 1/2 links and white ash bears S 51° W 19 1/2 links corner to David P. Quinns land: thence with his line S 47 3/4° W 15 1/100 poles to a stone planted in the line of Samuel Jones survey No. 1009: marked B on the plat): thence with said line N. 43 3/4° W passing a point corner to David P. Quinns & Philip Cline at 53 5/10 poles crossing a county road at from 53 5/10 to 60 poles crossing a branch of Lees creek at 150 5/10 poles passing a point at C on the plat, where a small white ash bears S 66 1/2° W 14 links: and dead red oak stump bears S 21° W 10 1/2 links: where we planted a stone for the west corner of the representatives of Simson Fosters survey No. 5355<sup>2nd</sup> south corner of Thomas Bagwells survey No 6298 at 168 3/10 poles 300 7/100 poles to a point at D on the plat where a small white ash stump of one of the original corner trees bears N. 10 1/2° W 20 links<sup>2nd</sup> small white ash stump of one of the original corner trees bears S 61° W 16 links, the red oak dead<sup>2nd</sup> down: the root bears N. 61° E 13 links: and marked a maple 15 inches in diameter which bears N. 45° E 15 1/2 links we planted a stone at said point for the north corner of said Jones survey No. 1009<sup>2nd</sup> west corner of said Thomas Bagwells survey No. 6298 and the line of Edward Dowers survey No. 811: thence with said line N. 47 1/2° E 53 5/100 poles to a stone (marked E on the plat) in the middle point between a red oak now dead<sup>2nd</sup> & a small white oak nearly dead & a double elm all close together east corner of said Dowers survey No 811 and corner to said L. Bagwells survey No. 6298<sup>2nd</sup> corner to a tract of land formerly owned by Jesse Matthew: now owned by William Francis: thence with the line of said tract N. 45 1/2° East passing a stake where an elm with nuzsh marks on bears S 1° W 11 links corner made by David Nickersham for the corner to said tract of land now owned by William Francis at 112 1/100 poles 113 6/100 poles to a point at F on the plat near two small elms with old marks on them both elms now dead: the ash now gone two elms and ash being called for in said Sharps deed: when after having surveyed the entire length of Daniel Morgans survey No 1061. Beginning at a stake ash and honey locust and running S 43 1/2° E 524 poles to a stone elm &c which corresponded with the old marked line very nearly through the whole length of said line it was found that said stake by two elms at (E) on the plat) was in the line of said Morgans survey No 1061: we planted a large stone at said point for the corner to said Sharps land to which John Small objected as it interfered with the land which he bought of Thomas Callam: thence with the line of
