

Beginning at a stone A most westerly corner of J. Watkins Survey No. 1265 also corner to the three surveys Nos. 1144 - 1557 and 2232 Thence with the original survey line between the two Watkins Surveys $N 35^{\circ} E$ crossing the line leading from Wilmington to New Burlington at 17.88 chains 24.7 chains to a stone C in said line corner to Calvin Dingley Thence with his line $S 62^{\circ} 55' E$ 4.68 chains to a stake D his corner in the line of a hedge fence Thence with said hedge fence $N 28^{\circ} 15' E$ to a stone E in the line of said hedge fence another corner of said Dingley Thence with his line $S 62^{\circ} 45' E$ to a stake F in his line (in a direct line between the said Stone E and the Stone J) a distance of ten chains corner to J. F. Oglebee Thence with his line $S 74^{\circ} 40' W$ crossing the aforesaid line at 21.10 chains 36.10 chains to a stone H in the original survey line between said surveys Nos. 1265 and 2232 in a direct line between the two stones I and A Thence with said line $N 63^{\circ} 53' W$ 14.10 chains to the beginning containing 47.93 acres of land.
