

GIS Data Availability

Due to the tireless efforts of the County Auditors Office and the County Engineers Office, the GIS Department has accumulated a vast amount of information and have made it available to the general public. Visitors to the web sites can create a map interactively, review property information, or download any of the hundreds of pre-made maps in adobe acrobat PDF format. Visitors can also e-mail any county staff and order CD's or DVD's of things such as surveys and aerial photography. If you give our Map Office or GIS Office a few days time, you can get any map you request in a PDF file format e-mailed directly to you. To get a brief description of what's available see

One Stop Shopping

For many years, the phrase "One Stop Shopping" has proliferated through local, state, and federal government agencies. What does it mean? When anyone needs information on a piece of property, they generally go (or are steered) to the County Engineer's Tax Map Office or to the Auditors Office. There, they ask one of the employees for help on locating information that might include a deed, a survey, a tax map, an address, an owner's name, or any one of a myriad of other things. Then, the county employee might have to go to the Recorders Office, or to the Auditor's Office, or back to the Engineers Office using up to four different isolated computers and up to 4 different programs or applications. One of the goals of a GIS implementation is to minimize the amount of travel that county employees and the public have to do to obtain property related information. Applications such as the GIS Department web page and the Auditors Office web page has greatly enhanced the ability of our county offices and agencies to serve the general public.
