This is the first of what I hope to be monthly updates for 2008 on GIS - News and Events from the GIS Office of Clinton County, Ohio...

2-foot contours are now available for download for users of AutoCAD and ArcView; the file sizes are formidable, so they are broken down into townships and (for a short time only) 6-sections spanning the county. This dataset is a key ingredient in having our Flood Plain maps updated, and I am happy to say that work on that has commenced. We will see preliminary flood-plain maps by the end of this year.
